



PROJECT GIGABIT

- Gigabit capable UK ambition (1000Mbps)
- 85% premise target by 2025
- Market to deliver to 80% of UK premises
- 17% of UK housing stock is social housing

WHY IT MATTERS

- Buoyant investor market many new entrants (2-4x wayleaves)
- Changes to legislation gives
 operators legal rights to request
 access
- Currently not a cost neutral process for landlords
- Currently many landlords do not have capacity and processes



CONNECTING SOCIAL HOUSING

- Want to see parity between social housing and market housing
- Want Kent's social housing sector to have a strong voice
- Raise awareness of any challenging asks from telecom's providers
- Increased property appeal and value
- Improved living standards for digitally included residents

Create a database of key contacts (GDPR compliant)

Create a standardised Kent agreement (learning from best practice in London)

Provisions within the Code allow for cost recovery

Address historic issues using Kent wayleave
