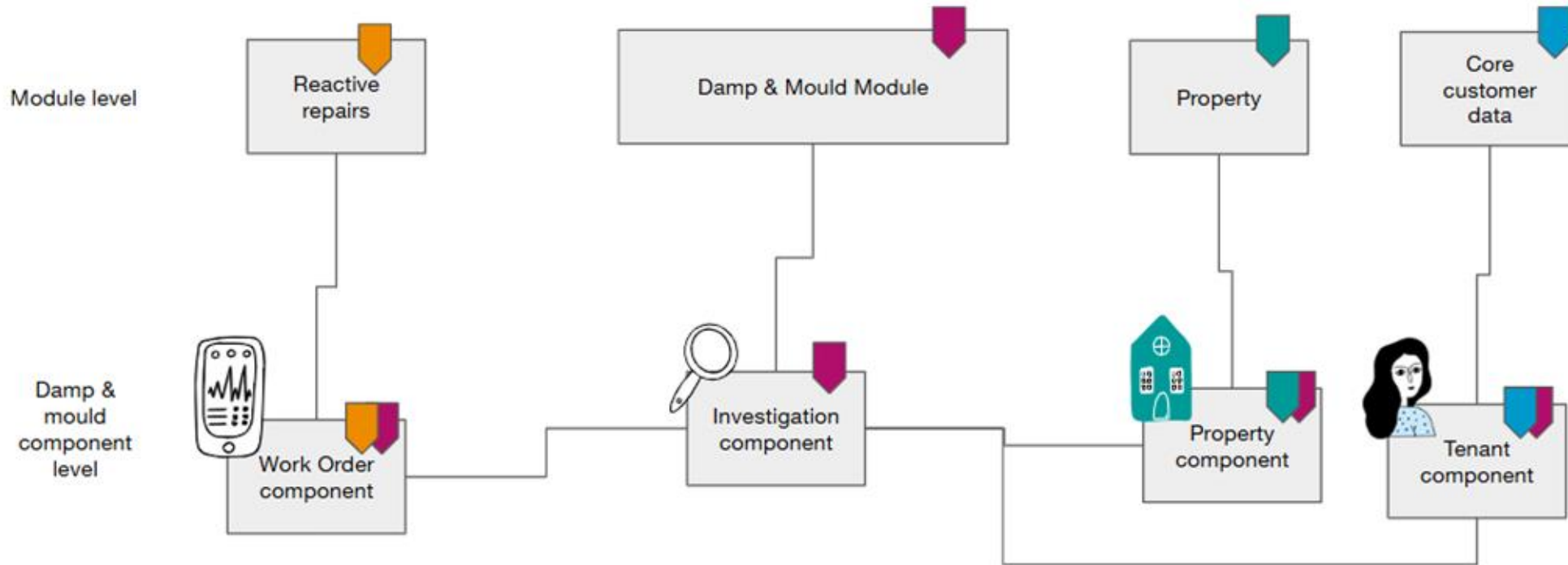


Awaab's Law process for damp & mould
